

Who Hawai'i CHCs Served in 2007

- 107,139 individual clients
- Largest single group was Native Hawaiian.
Fastest growing group was Pacific Islanders.
- 16% needed language assistance

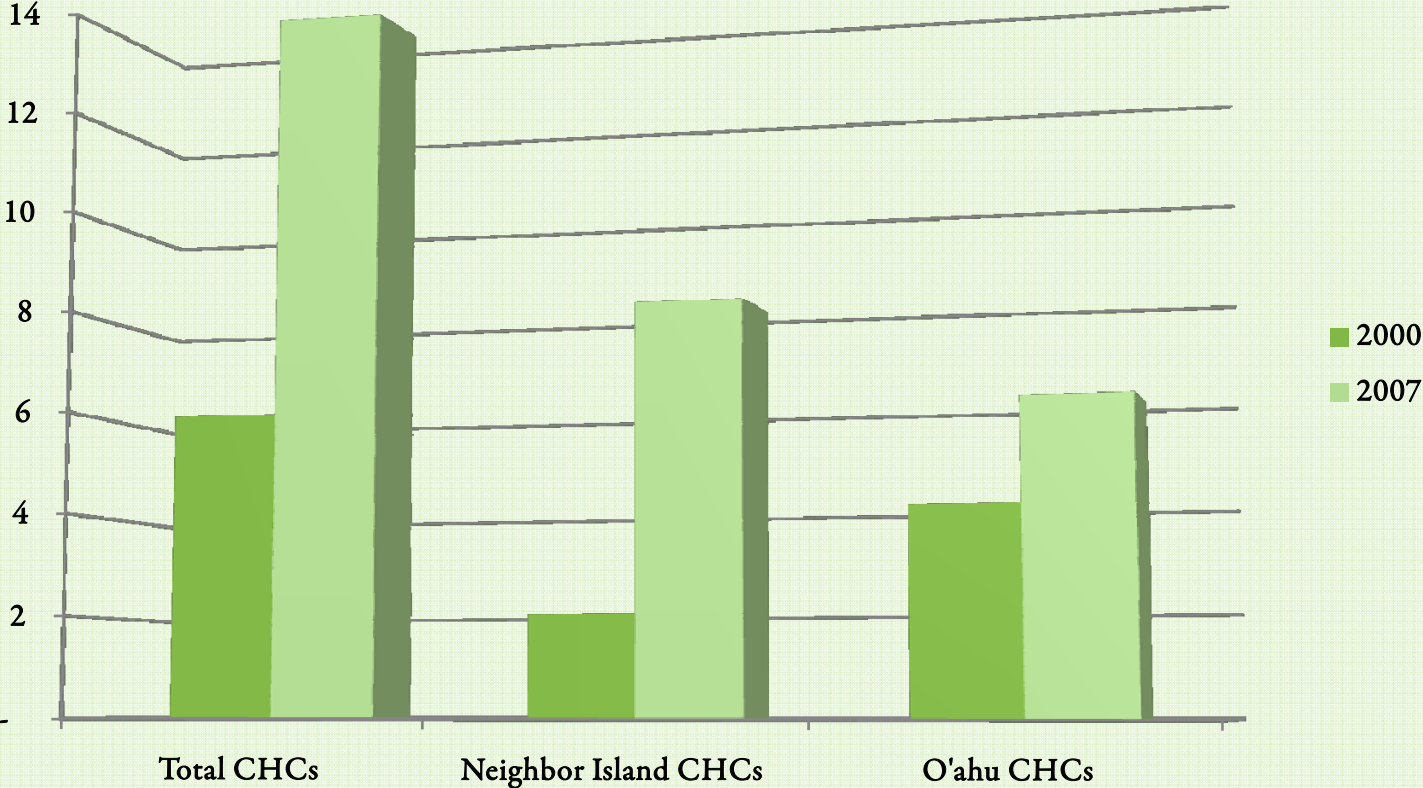


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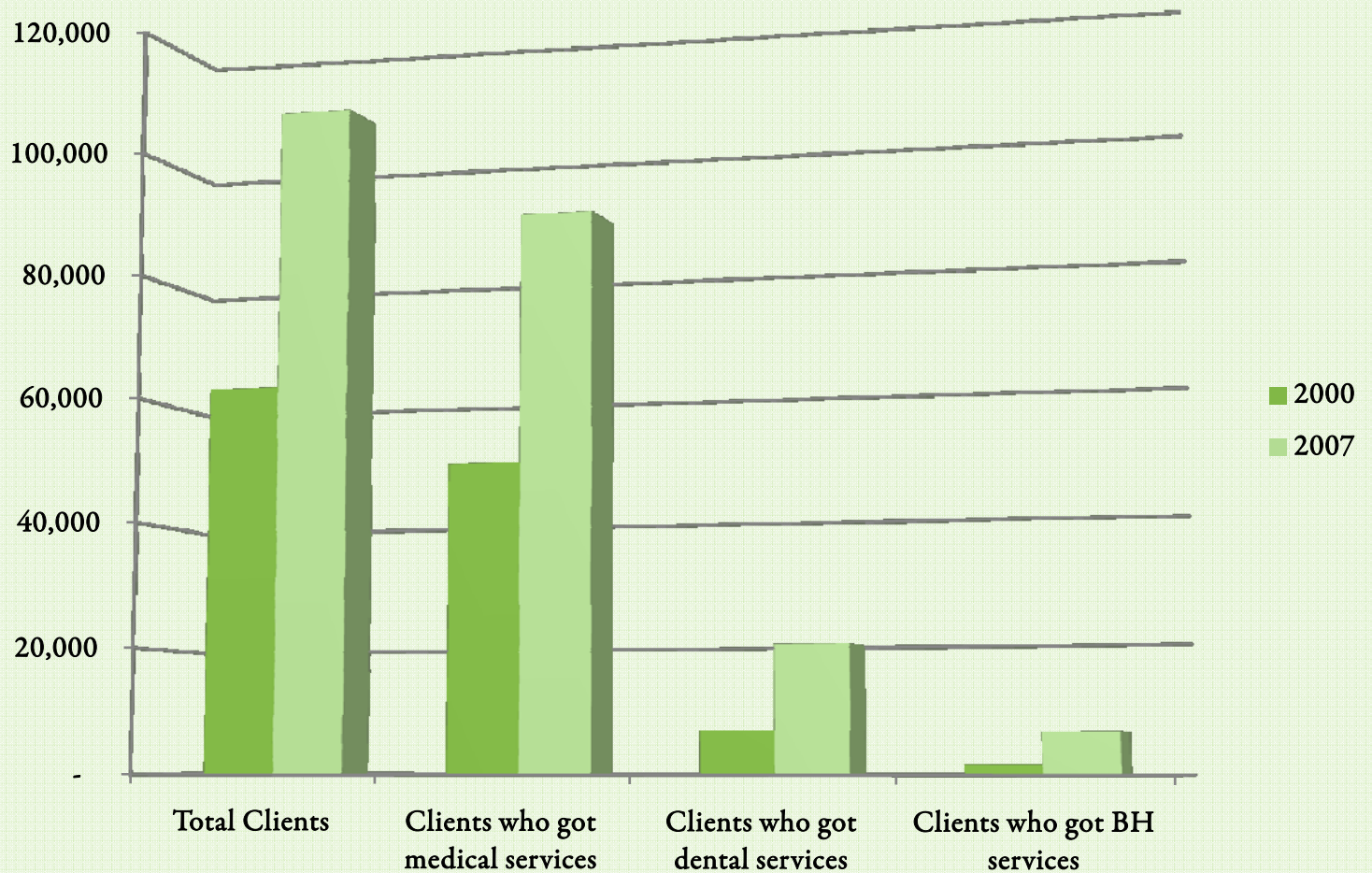
- Nearly 3/4 were at or below 100% of poverty
- 11,558 clients were homeless
- Med-QUEST and uninsured still account for 70% of patients but Medicare is the coverage group that is growing fastest
- 77,000 clients lived in rural areas and 30,000 were urbanites



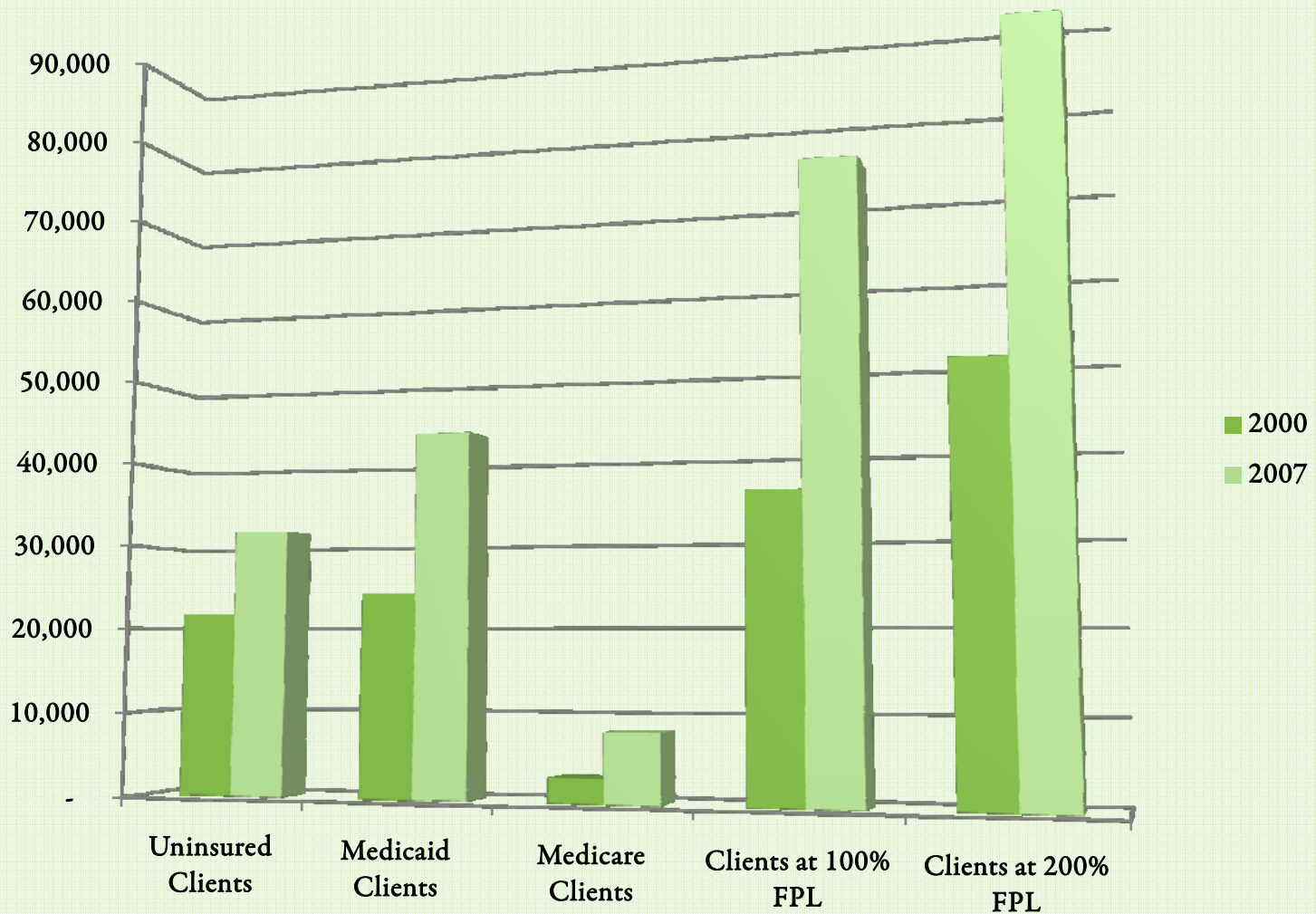
CHC Trends, 2000-07



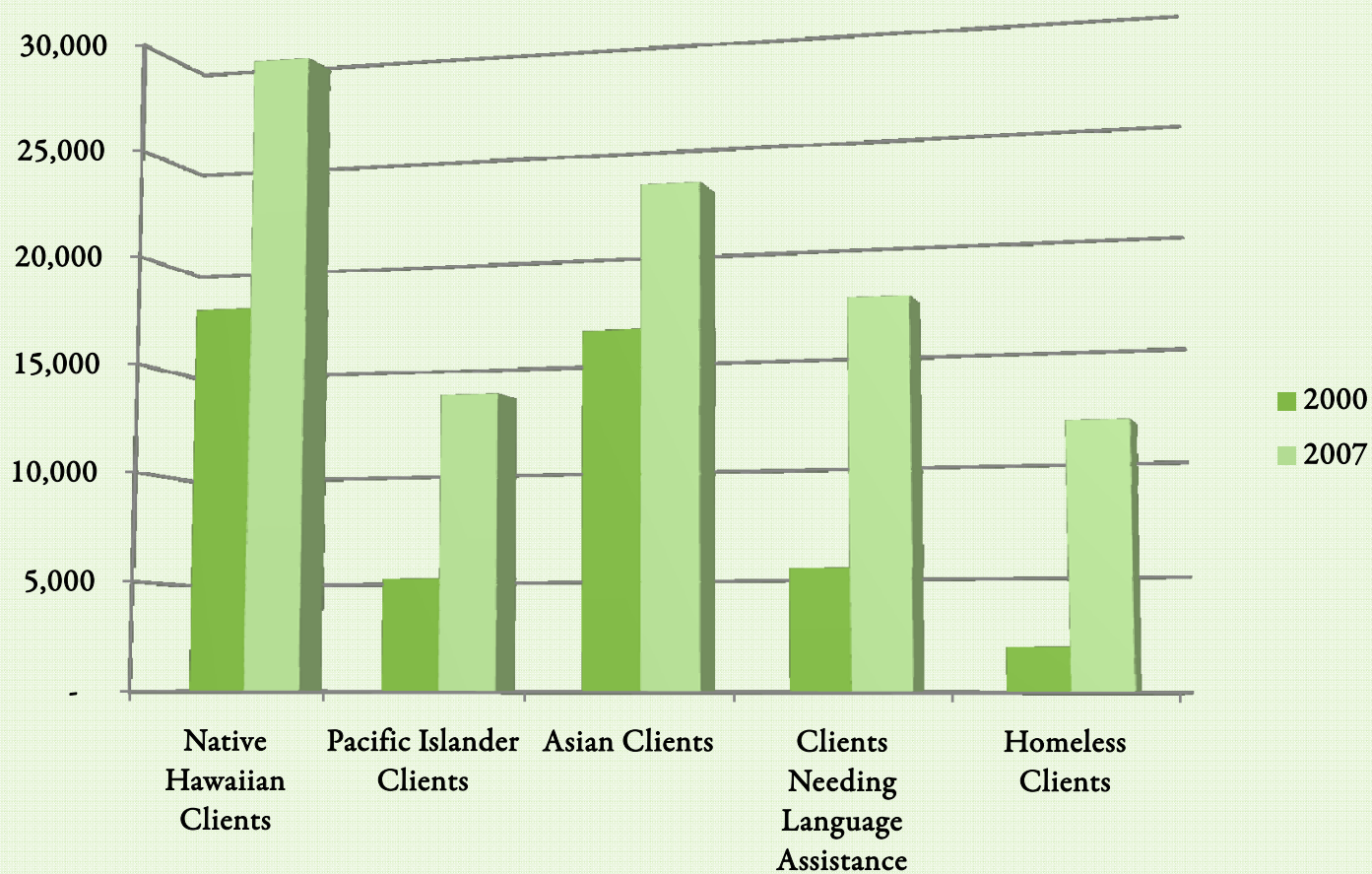

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CHCs as Economic Engines

- Economic value of CHCs has grown from \$73 million in 2000 to \$186 million in 2007.
 - Hawai'i Island: \$30 million
 - Maui Island: \$15 million
 - Moloka'i: \$4 million
 - Kaua'i: \$13 million
 - O'ahu: \$124 million



CHCs as Economic Engines

- CHCs employ 1,100 people and support 1,900 jobs.
 - Hawai'i Island: 164 employed/310 jobs
 - Maui Island: 83 employed/151 jobs
 - Moloka'i: 17 employed/38 jobs
 - Kaua'i: 70 employed/130 jobs
 - O'ahu: 791 employed/1282 jobs



Savings to Health Care System*

- CHCs save \$1,000/Medicaid client - **\$43 million in Hawai'i.**
- CHCs save \$900/uninsured client - **\$29 million in Hawai'i.**
- CHCs save \$1914/privately insured patient - **\$47 million in Hawai'i.**
