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### **Community Health Center Funding Fact Sheet**

In calendar year 2006, the thirteen community health centers\* operating across the state of Hawai'i reported receiving income totaling \$81 million. Notably:

- **58% of these funds came from patient fees and public and private insurance reimbursement.**
  - **Although 30% of the people served at health centers are uninsured, these clients are able to contribute only 3% of all health center income.**
  - **Medicaid/QUEST alone accounts for 40% of all health center revenue. This is by far the largest source of their funding.**
- **State and county funds account for 15% of revenues.**
